

Ishikawa Prefecture Measures Related to Prevention of New Coronavirus Infections

1. Period: Until May 31, 2020

2. Area: Whole of Ishikawa Prefecture

3. Contents of measures to be implemented:

① Thoroughly avoid an overlap of the “Three Cs” (①Closed spaces with poor ventilation ② Crowded places with many people nearby ③Close-contact settings such as close-range conversations within a 2 meter distance)

② Request to refrain from nonessential and non-urgent outings

- In order to avoid contact with others as much as possible, Ishikawa residents are strongly urged to refrain from going out unless it is necessary to maintain everyday life.
- In particular, it is strongly urged to avoid visiting bars, nightclubs and restaurants in the downtown area that serve customers.

③ Request to refrain from traveling between prefectures

- Residents are urged to refrain from non-urgent trips outside of the prefecture (including business trips), in addition to receiving non-urgent visits from those outside of the prefecture.

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④ Request to refrain using certain facilities

i) Facilities essentially requested to close

- Request to refrain from using certain facilities

Amusement facilities, educational facilities, universities/cram schools etc., exercise/sporting facilities, theaters, meeting/exhibition facilities, hotels or inns (areas used for meetings), commercial facilities

*Underlined facilities limited to those with a total floor area exceeding 1000m²

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ii) Facilities essentially not requested to close

Facilities required to maintain social life (those selling daily necessities, serving food etc.), social welfare facilities (nursery schools, health care facilities for the elderly etc.)

*Upon compliance with infection control measures

⑤ Request to refrain from holding events

As a general rule, organizers are requested to refrain from holding events, parties, or other activities that could result in people coming together in crowds, regardless of whether these are held indoors or outdoors.

⑥ Securing daily necessities

With regard to the securing of supplies such as food, medicines and daily necessities, business operators should create an environment in which residents can purchase items with peace of mind, and are discouraged from buying up goods.

⑦ Creation of consultation service

The service for businesses and residents affected by the Emergency Measures Act shall be extended, providing thorough assistance related to the situation.
